 - i. Describe the research strategy, preliminary data, methodology and analysis plan to accomplish each specific aim.
 - d. Timeline to accomplish aims ($\leq \frac{1}{2}$ page)
 - e. References (not included in page limit)
5. Training Plan
 - a. Applicant's Background (≤ 1 page)
 - i. Describe applicant's research and, if applicable, clinical background.
 - b. Goals for Postdoctoral Training (≤ 1 pages). Describe the goals for the training period and the applicant's longer-term career goals.
 - i. Identify specific skills, approaches and concepts to be learned and how this will be accomplished ($\leq \frac{1}{2}$ page).
 - ii. Explain how the proposed research project and training will facilitate the applicant's transition to independence as a researcher.
